BLOOD DONATION

It's that time of year to gear up for fun in the sun. School's out, vacations are planned and longstanding routines are replaced with carefree, casual days. It's also a time when the need for blood often outpaces donations.

Highschool and college students donate about 20 percent of the blood collected through the American Red Crossat scheduled drives on their campuses. When those drives are not held during the summer months donation totals drop. In addition, individuals who donate regularly

at their place of worship, workplace or a donor center may overlook giving blood when summer activities fill calendars.

"The need for blood never takes a vacation," said Sharyn Whitman, CEO for the Indiana-Ohio Blood Services Region of the American Red Cross. "We encourage everyone who can donate to pick a date, make an appointment and honor that appointment to help keep our community blood supply strong."

Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. These individuals are someone's friend, relative or neighbor. What if one of your loved ones needs blood this summer? Will the blood be available when needed?

"The Red Cross and the patients who receive lifesaving blood depend on volunteers to donate blood, even during the summer," said Whitman. "Add a blood donation to your list of summer activities. Your single donation could help save the lives of up to three patients and impact the lives of those three patients' friends and relatives."

To schedule an appointment to donate please call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or visit redcrossblood.org for more information. Individuals who are 17 years of age (16 with parental permission in Indiana and Ohio), meet weight and height requirements (110 pounds or more, depending on their height) and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. Please bring your Red Cross blood donor card or other form of positive ID when you come to donate.

Now I am trying to get quilters interested in taking part in the quilt show during the Salamonie Summer Festival. So all you ladies and gents who are quilters we would like for you to show your talents or show those cherished antique or aged quilts. Check the Warren Weekly for information.

I can recall many a time especially on cold winter days mom made her quilts and I would get to help knot them, seemed like it took forever to get one completed. She always made sure the tied off knots were the same length and she measured them by the length of one of her finger joints. Now I just eyeball it.

Recently a group of us finished 50 lap quilts for children with MD who will be going to summer camp, that was a rewarding experience. They also received a pillow slip for their own personal pillow.

I have finally got most all flowers planted for now and will be doing more this fall for spring showing and summer next. Now it is time to relax and enjoy the patio and think about a plan for fall.

Some time ago I bought a cook book that is called The Little Box of Quilters Chocolate Desserts. With each card is a recipe and directions to make a quilt block. It is fun to get it out and drool over the recipes and think someday I will make some of the quilt blocks. So far I have not done much of either. I share a recipe that someday I will make.

Double Chocolate Coconut Scones

2 cups flour, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder, 2 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon soda, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup butter cut in small pieces, 2 eggs slightly beaten, 2/3 cup whipping cream, 11/2 teaspoon vanilla, 1/3 cup shredded coconut, 1/3 cup semisweet chocolate miniature pieces and granulated

Preheat oven to 425° line a large baking sheet with foil. In a large $bowl \, combine \, drying redients. \, Using \, a \, pastry \, blender \, cut \, in \, butter \,$ until coarse and crumbly. Make a well in the center in the flour mix. In a small bowl stir in eggs, vanilla and cream. Add to the dry mixture and stir just till moistened stir in coconut and chocolate pieces. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead 6 times, dough will be sticky and handle as little as possible. Divide dough in half. Pat each into a 5 inch round and transfer to the baking sheet, score each round into 6 wedge pieces scoring about 1/4 inch deep. Sprinkle with sugar, bake about 12 minutes cool on wire rack, serve warm.

Try it you might like it. Have a great summer.


