### HOMELAND FOUNDATION **SCHOLARSHIPS OPEN**

Indiana college students who volunteer with a public safety organization can now apply for the FY 2022 round of Homeland Indiana Security Foundation scholarship.

The Indiana Homeland Security Foundation offers higher scholarship education financial Indiana assistance for students who wish to pursue a degree.

A full-time student with at least 12 credit hours per semester is eligible for a \$2,000 scholarship and a parttime student with at least six hours per semester is eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship. The scholarship must be used during the awarded school year, and the funds are intended solely to reimburse eligible student educational expenses.

Eligible applicants include Indiana residents who are an continuing incoming or student who:

- \* Attends or will be attending an accredited Indiana college.
- \* Must have a grade point average of 2.8 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- \* Volunteers at a public safety organization such as fire, law enforcement, emergency management or emergency medical services (validated by chief executive). The Indiana Homeland Security Foundation board will determine compliance eligibility. For more

- \* Keep safety devices lifesaving equipment handy (pole, rope and personal flotation devices) and know should be kept on both sides of the pool and should remain stationary - not be follow.
