SOUDER'S HONORED

On Saturday, October 20th, 2018, the Dewey and Julia Souder Family was recognized by the Huntington County Honors group. Huntington County Honors states that as its mission, it "recognizes and celebrates those, past and present, whose achievements have enhanced life in Huntington County, our Nation, and our World." Candidates of the Honors designation must have made a lasting contribution to the betterment of Huntington County.

There were five inductee categories, including the "Business & Professional" nominees, for which the Souder family was honored. Long-time employee, Barbara Souder, wife of the late Philip Souder, and David Souder, their son and current CEO of Heritage Pointe Communities, were present to accept the award on behalf of the family.

The nominees, Dewey and Julia Souder, were appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Memorial Home for the Aged in 1937. Dewey and Julia moved to Warren, Indiana, from pastoring a Methodist Church in Roanoke, Indiana, to be the Administrators of the Methodist Home.

Dr. Souder served as the Administrator for 28 years, followed by his son, Philip E. Souder, who took over full leadership responsibilities in 1965. Philip and Barbara continued to serve the community together for over thirty years. The current United Methodist Memorial Home CEO is David P. Souder, Philip and Barbara's son, who has served in that capacity since 1993.

The United Methodist Memorial Home was founded on the

| 2c. diced apples | 1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon |
| 1c. sugar | 1 tsp soda |
| 1 egg | 1/2 c. nuts |
| 1c. flour | |

Combine apples and sugar. Let set till the sugar dissolves. Add egg and beat well. Sift dry ingredients together and stir into apple mixture. Add nuts. Mix well. Bake at 375 for 35 to 40 minutes.

| 1/2c. white sugar | 1/4 c. margarine |
| 1c. water | 1tsp. vanilla |

Combine in a sauce pan both sugars and the flour, mix together then add the water. Cook for 5 minutes or until clear, then add margarine and vanilla and stir until margarine melts. Pour sauce on cake as soon as it is removed from the oven.

and gingerbread house contest and enjoy music on the new stage at Riverside Park.

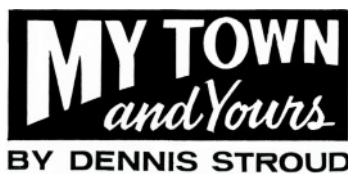

In 1998, the Knight Civic Center board learned that Garnet Bergman, who had just passed away, left the Civic Center a good amount of money. There were two requests with this donation. First, we had to wait ten years and the second was to put their name on the building. Ten years later the building was officially called the Knight Bergman Center. The money was moved to an Edward Jones account and agreed to spend the interest only.

The KBC has come along way in the past 36 years. We started out with a five-member board and half way through the by-laws were changed to a fourteen-member board. We are now looking for four or five board members. STICKING WITH EXERCISE FOR BETTER PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH

It isn't news that there are many benefits to regular exercise, yet this nation still faces a growing obesity problem, high levels of stress and increased incidences of depression, despite the fact that numerous studies show exercise can help combat all of this and more.

While most of us have a whole range of excuses for not getting regular exercise, the reality is that it actually isn't that difficult to get an effective exercise program started and to stick with it.

The key, if you currently aren't exercising on a regular basis, is to start slowly. Almost nothing can kill that determination to exercise like trying to do too much, and the feeling sore, tired and discouraged the next day.

The goal of regular exercise is to get at least 30 minutes of activity most days of the week, but this doesn't have to be your starting point. If you are currently sedentary, first check with your family physician before starting an exercise program.

When you do start, keep it simple. Maybe 15 to 20 minutes of any mild physical activity that you enjoy. It can be a brisk walk, a short bicycle ride or just walking one flight of stairs at

work instead of that elevator. Look for exercise that gets you moving and breathing just a little harder. You can then increase the time or exertion level slowly so that you feel comfortable as you get into better shape.

Another way to stick with an exercise program is to make it part of your routine. Put it into your phone calendar just like you would a business meeting or an appointment. Make it a time each day when you spend a few minutes on yourself.

It also helps to keep a journal of your exercise. Do a simple note for each day of what you did, how long you exercised and how you felt when you began and after you finished. Odds are good

that if you're a bit stressed or anxious when you began, you'll find you're more relaxed and calm when you finish.

Numerous studies have found that exercise is a great way to reduce stress and anxiety. And its health benefits? Combating heart disease, losing weight, helping control diabetes, just to name a few. Exercising regularly and getting more fit is one of the best things you can do for your body and your mind.
