1 ½ c. creamy peanut butter, 1 c. soft butter, 1 c. packed brown sugar, 1 c. sugar, 2 eggs, 1 tsp. Vanilla, 2 c. flour, 1 ½ tsp. soda, ½ tsp. Salt, 1 to 2 c. Reese's Pieces, ½ to 1 c. chocolate chips, ½ to 1 c. peanut butter chips, ½ c. peanuts.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. With mixer beat together

Our county increases the use of public aid to support children and families throughout the year but this season upon us is one in which hardship seems to bear the most weight.

More and more families are taking use of the foodbanks we have across the county, so much so that many have ran out of food many times throughout the year!

As Christmas approaches, I believe that a major problem

in our community with obvious evidence, is the increasing number of children in low income or families facing poverty. According to the NCCP, in 2018, 45% of children in the state of Indiana were living in low-income families (Poverty, 2018). Although this is a vast number spread across the state of Indiana, our state is 4% above the national average of children in low income families.

This is increasing and is obvious in our county as our foodbanks cannot supply families with food, we have to consider what other things children in these families may not have.

I proudly say that many locations in our small town of Warren support the Angel Tree project by giving toys and meals to families in need in our community just before Christmas this year. This is an amazing opportunity for our small community to bind together to make an impact although there is so much more children need besides toys.

I think we should consider a separate drive this season for winter clothing, socks, winter toiletries such as moisturizing lotion and Chapstick as it gets colder each week. These are ways we can impact these families for months on end, rather than just a few weeks of the Christmas season.

Please consider donating to the Warren Food Pantry as often as you can of whatever they need, volunteer at the Huntington County Soup Kitchen, get involved with these families and change their lives for more than just one day because that's "what people do this time of year".
