


He was listed as one of the 31 National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Division I Men¹s Basketball Scholar Athletes.

PESTICIDE CLEAN-SWEEP

The Indiana Clean Sweep Project, sponsored by the Purdue-based Office of the Indiana State Chemist (OISC), allows farmers and others to get rid of up to 250 pounds of weed killers, insecticides, rodenticides, fungicides and miticides free of charge.

The 4-H Community Building at Hier's Park in Huntington will be a collection site for this project on Thursday August 11 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Other collection sites and dates across the state include Marshall County Fairgrounds in Argos, IN on August 9, the Hendricks County Fairgrounds in Danville, IN on August 16, and the Jefferson County Fairgrounds in Madison, IN on August 18.

This is a great opportunity to legally dispose of unwanted products at little or no cost. All public and private schools, golf courses, nurseries, farmers, ag dealers, cities, towns, municipalities and county units of government DAY CAMP are eligible to participate in the program.

Individuals looking to dispose of more than 250 pounds will be permitted to do so, but a fee of \$2 per pound will be charged for the additional amount. One gallon is about 8 pounds.

The on-line planning form should be completed as accurately as possible in advance of this program. It is important to mail, fax or email the completed form to KevinNealat765-494-4331 or nealk@purdue.edu no later than Tuesday, August 2, 2011. Containers should be labeled, leak-free and safe to transport when delivered to the collection site. The OISC also does not want any mixing of materials brought for disposal. It is also recommended that participants bring a list of products being carried along with a contact phone number in case of an emergency.

The OISC reserves the right to cancel this Pesticide Clean Sweep Project if there is not adequate demand. Participants submitting the planning form by August 2, 2011 will be contacted immediately if cancellation is necessary

As noted on the OISC Web site, "The Indiana State Chemist is charged with administering several agricultural laws involving seeds, fertilizers, animal feeds and pesticides.

The goals of these laws are to ensure truth-in-labeling, food safety, user safety and protection of environment."

The Clean Sweep Project is sponsored annually by the OISC to help farmers and others using pesticides to get rid of unwanted chemicals.


