On Wednesday evening, July 20, the Van Buren Town Council met in Council Room at Town Hall. President Tony Manry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

In his police report Officer Pat Collins said there had been numerous reports of vandalism around town. He said residents have reported that when they hear noises the culprits have left by the time they check the situation. Because most of the incidents happened during the night it was suggested residents call the Sheriff's department at 765/668-8168 and they will dispatch local officials to the scene.

Collins said the Police department has arranged for extra coverage during the upcoming Popcorn Festival. The Sheriff's department will also assist.

Superintendent Jim Webb gave his report. He said Donny Plummer is currently working

at the wastewater plant and training to assist while full-time employees are on vacation.

Webb had also talked with INDOT about paving State Road 5. He was informed they will only patch areas outside of town, using stone and asphalt and will put on a top coat in town.

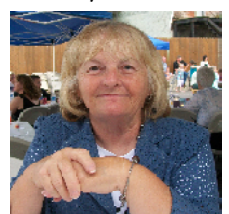

PESTICIDE CLEAN-SWEEP

The Indiana Clean Sweep Project, sponsored by the Purdue-based Office of the Indiana State Chemist (OISC), allows farmers and others to get rid of up to 250 pounds of weed killers, insecticides, rodenticides, fungicides and miticides free of charge.

The 4-H Community Building at Hier's Park in Huntington will be a collection site for this project on Thursday August 11 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Other collection sites and dates across the state include the Marshall County Fairgrounds in Argos, IN on August 9, the Hendricks County Fairgrounds in Danville, IN on August 16, and the Jefferson County Fairgrounds in Madison, IN on August 18.

This is a great opportunity to legally dispose of unwanted products at little or no cost. All public and private schools, golf courses, nurseries, farmers, ag dealers, cities, towns, municipalities and

county units of government are eligible to participate in the program.

Individuals looking to dispose of more than 250 pounds will be permitted to do so, but a fee of \$2 per pound will be charged for the additional amount. One gallon is about 8 pounds.

Note that a planning form is available on-line at this web address: http://www.isco.purdue.edu/pesticide/pest_pdf/2011_clean_sweep.pdf.

The on-line planning form should be completed as accurately as possible in advance of this program. It is important to mail, fax or e-mail the completed form to Kevin Neal at 765-494-4331 or nealk@purdue.edu no later than Tuesday, August 2, 2011. Containers should be labeled, leak-free and safe to transport when delivered to the collection site. The OISC also does not want any mixing of materials brought for disposal. It is also recommended that participants bring a list of products being carried along with a contact phone number in case of an emergency.

The OISC reserves the right to cancel this Pesticide Clean Sweep Project if there is not adequate demand. Participants submitting the planning form by August 2, 2011 will be contacted immediately if cancellation is necessary.

As noted on the OISC Web site, "The Indiana State Chemist is charged with administering several agricultural laws involving seeds, fertilizers, animal feeds and pesticides. The goals of these laws are to ensure truth-in-labeling, food safety, user safety and protection of our environment."

The Clean Sweep Project is sponsored annually by the OISC to help farmers and others using pesticides to get rid of unwanted chemicals.


BIKE CHALLENGE
