

# CYBERSEEK INDIANA **RESOURCE LAUNCHES TO PROMOTE JOBS IN GROWING CYBERSECURITY INDUSTRY**

As cybersecurity threats and attacks continue to increase, the State of Indiana is introducing the Cyberseek Indiana online resource to promote and support job growth in the emerging industry of cybersecurity.

The Indiana Department of Workforce Development (DWD) is partnering with the Purdue Cyber Apprenticeship Program (P-CAP), Burning Technologies CompTIA to help close the cybersecurity skills gap in Indiana.

Visitors to the Cyberseek site will find a variety of useful information about supply and demand in the cybersecurity job market, heat maps showing locations of jobs and apprenticeships, and contacts for training providers. 


