Hamburger patties are \$3.50 per pound and bulk is \$3.25.

TREE DISEASES

Folks are noticing diseases with their trees this spring. One disease being found in trees across Indiana is anthracnose. The cool and wet conditions that occurred in April as leaves were emerging is the main culprit. In the Huntington County area leaves infected with anthracnose are appearing in oak and maple trees this spring. It is caused by a fungus, and affected leaves will look different depending on the type of tree. **Fungicides** are not recommended to control this disease.

In some cases maple leaves are shriveling up and trees are nearly defoliated because of anthracnose. Gail Ruhl from the Plant and Pest Diagnostic Lab on the Purdue campus notes that trees are stressed from last year's drought and producing a second crop of leaves to replace those that fall prematurely may cause additional stress. Proper care of drought-stressed trees during the coming summer will be critical.

Lindsey Purcell, Purdue Urban Forestry Specialist recommends the following:

* mulch trees with 2-3 inches of

fresh organic mulch (keeping it away from the trunk)

* prune out only dead wood and minimize pruning of green wood to reduce wounding.

* make sure plantings get 1 inch of water each week from either irrigation or rain

* do not fertilize this year as this will only stress the tree/ shrubs by forcing new growth

Ruhl has previously taught Master Gardener interns in **Huntington County about plant** diseases. She uses a triangle drawing to describe how a disease develops in plants. In other words, each of the three sides of the triangle represents something, which must happen for a disease to take hold in a plant. The first side of the triangle is "susceptible host plant", which means that a plant must be prone to getting the disease. The second side is "active pathogen" – this is what causes the disease (ie. fungus). The third side of the triangle is "favorable environment for infection" - note that this usually means experiencing damp weather.
