Thank you to this amazing community! Now that things have slowed down and I have had time to reflect on the 50th Anniversary of the Salamonie Summer Festival, here is my report. When I was first asked to co-chair the festival I said no. However, I took a step back and understood that it was the 50th anniversary and I really wanted to help make it special, so I accepted the position and was bound and determined to make it the best festival ever! With the help of LITERALLY hundreds of volunteers putting in thousands of hours of preparation, planning, and hard work and the generous donations of sponsorship's from dozens of businesses it was definitely one to remember! I would just like to give a final report on how everything ended up. The Festival Committee started with \$5000 in the bank last fall. Warren Health and Fitness and its' sponsors donated approximately \$25,000 the 50th to Anniversary. \$9000 of that being raised between two benefit dinners to double the fireworks display. WHF and sponsors also paid for all **PORK CHOP SUPPER** of the marketing (banners, Your friends \$11,000 in ticket sales. The needs. The meal features

concert cost approx. \$14,500 and brought in approx. \$12,000 in ticket sales. The fireworks were \$18,000. All total with marketing our budget was approximately \$90,000. We are very proud to say that the festival committee ended with over \$20,000 in the bank for the future.

With all the expenses for the WAR games and the donations that we made to the 50th Anniversary festival it has put a strain on Warren Health and Fitness's budget, we believe it was well worth it and WHF's mission was accomplished therefore, I have resigned from the festival committee to focus all of my energy on Warren Health and Fitness's mission, which is dedicated to improving the quality of human life and to helping all people realize their fullest potential as children of God, through mental, physical, and spiritual development. I am excited to continue helping Warren Health and Fitness be the change we want to see in the world.

Mom's recipe for Peanut Butter Cookies

1 cup peanut butter, 1 cup granulated sugar, 1 cup brown sugar, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup butter, 3 cups flour, 2 teaspoon soda. Combine the butter and sugars, add in eggs then dry ingredients. Form into balls the size of a walnut, place in lightly greased bake sheet and press down each with fork to slightly flatten. Bake 350 about 10 minutes. Sure was good with fresh cows milk.

SANCTUARY CELEBRATION

Dillman Church, a member of the United Brethren in Christ denomination and located at 8888 S 1100 W-90 in Warren, has undergone an extensive sanctuary renovation and welcomes the public to a Dedication Service and Open House on Sunday, September 10, 2017. Service The Dedication begins at 9 am. Todd Fetters, Bishop of the United Brethren in Christ, will give a brief dedication message and prayer. Pastor Matt Kennedy will then speak on the future of Dillman

Church and its involvement in the Southern Wells community. Following the service, at 11 am, a community Open House and Celebration begins with a hog roast lunch, bouncy house, dunk tank and other outdoor games and activities for the whole family.

Changes to the sanctuary include expansion of the blueprint to include seating for 200+ people. Movable chairs will make the space adaptable for things like an open area for children's programming or the inclusion of tables for small conferences. New carpet and lighting have been added, along with new audio-visual capabilities. The sanctuary renovation is the first major renovation of the sanctuary since it was repaired after a storm in 1948. "The goal of

this renovation is more than just modernization," says Pastor Matt Kennedy. "With the changes that have been made, we are equipped for future growth in order that we might meet the needs of both today's and tomorrow's generations and better serve the surrounding community for many years to come."

Dillman Church was established in 1889 and the sanctuary dedicated December 22 of that year with Bishop Milton Wright (father of famous aviation duo Orville and Wilbur Wright). In 1907, structure was remodeled and included the installation of new flooring and roof as well as the rebuilding of the pulpit platform. A dedication service for that remodeling was held on November 3. 1907. In 1955, a basement and new entrance were added to the building, as well as a new indoor restroom. An extension that included a fellowship hall. facilities kitchen and restrooms was added in 1977. Classroom space and church offices were added on in the mid 1990s.

About Dillman Church: The mission of Dillman Church is to Become the People of God on the Mission of God. Weekly worship service time is at 9 am every Sunday morning. Following the worship service are programming for children and youth, as well as a

gathering for adults called Sermon Sequel - a time of discussion that allow the interaction about including messages, questions and application. GETTING READY FOR BABY

For most women expecting the birth of their first child, life is suddenly filled with new questions. How should I be taking care of myself? What does a normal pregnancy look like? How do I need to prepare to bring my baby home from the hospital?

Fortunately, moms-to-be have a friendly, helpful resource in Angela Swanson, birth planner and lactation consultant at Parkview Huntington Hospital's Family Birthing Center (FBC). Swanson can help each mom-to-be learn about the phases of her pregnancy, plan for her baby's delivery, and connect with resources for needed mother/baby items.

"I really encourage each woman to become informed, and to take advantage of our many options," says Swanson. "Our FBC offers free classes here at the hospital in preparing for childbirth and breastfeeding. These classes are packed with useful information, and moms can always ask questions."

Informative classes

Childbirth class not only covers what to expect with labor, delivery, and immediately after the baby is born (postpartum), but also tips in parenting a newborn and types of health screening the baby will

receive before discharge from the hospital.

Breastfeeding class can be helpful, too. "We teach moms-to-be how to get off to a good start," says Swanson. "That includes positioning, latching, what's normal and what's not, and how to know if baby's getting enough milk. This can be very important for moms who are not familiar with breastfeeding. Even for women whose mothers did breastfeed and can offer advice based on personal experience, it's a good idea to attend this class, because every woman's experience is different."

Each a unique birth experience

The free classes are just the beginning. When expectant mom chooses to have her baby at Parkview Huntington, she can also make a birth planning appointment. Swanson mom-to-be the walks through every aspect of designing her own unique birth experience.

"There's no need for a mom to settle for cookie-cutter," says Swanson. "Going through all of the details in advance and knowing what she wants well before the birth allows us to take better care of her."

That includes Mom's preferences about:

- Ways to help her relax during labor (such as dimming lights, playing soothing music, or taking a warm shower)
- Who will be in the room during the delivery
- Measures that can be used to manage pain and discomfort
- Relaxation steps following delivery (such as aromatherapy)

"We even have free Wi-Fi," says Swanson. "Or if Mom wants to make a playlist for her stay and bring her device with her, she's welcome to do that. It's about whatever is going to make her feel comfortable."

Birth planning also includes discussion of what the mom should bring to the hospital for herself and the baby, services and supplies the hospital provides, information to fill out the birth certificate, and security measures in place in the FBC so Mom can be confident her baby is safe at all times.

"Busy moms are often glad to learn that Parkview MyChart (Parkview's electronic medical record) is a great tool for connecting with their OB/GYN's office to get answers to their questions, particularly as they come to the later weeks of their pregnancy," says Swanson.

Good advice

The sooner a mom-to-be begins planning her birth experience, the fewer decisions she has to make when the baby arrives. Swanson offers this advice from her roughly 10 years as a lactation consultant and birth planner at Parkview Huntington:

- "Take classes, so you know what's normal during a typical pregnancy."
- "Explore your options so you can choose the ones that are right for you and make a plan. Don't let anyone tell you how they think your delivery should go. This is your baby and your experience."
- "Make sure you rest, and make yourself, your baby and your significant other a priority." Don't give in to the temptation to let too many

people visit you in the crucial first days and weeks after baby arrives. Some women can be prone to postpartum depression, and getting worn out – especially if baby's not letting you sleep much – can make depression more likely.

Swanson says she wants moms-to-be to have the information they need to make having a baby a healthier, less stressful, and more joyful experience. After all, she's a mom, too.


