



An Alaskan & Yukon TRIP DAY # 6

by Larry Ryan The best and most accessible route to Dawson City in the Territory from Fairbanks was by airplane. We took off at 9:45 am. in an Air North jet. The jetliner southeast arrived at our destination at hour time change with our wristwatches.

The aircraft crossed the Yukon River and landed on a gravel air strip! Prior to touchdown, we saw what appeared to be a "Top of the World Highway." It was! The mountain road followed ridges northward bypassed Dawson City. Land travelers had to use a ferry boat to cross the river to gain access into the town.

Dawson City has a population of 2,000. mining in the area is still the # 1 business with tourism coming in second. Its main highway through town is Front Street which is a composition of clay, small rocks and sand packed firmly. The together remaining streets are composed of gravel and dirt.

Our hotel room was across the mostly, muddy street from the main building. It looked like a Wild West town as seen in cowboy movies.

The silt from the White River previously mixed with the same muddy type material from the adjacent Yukon River created a notable, visible phenomenon when that water came into contact at the confluence with the clear, ice melt water from the Klondike River. The two waterways did not mix well! They remained separated for several miles. Cold too!

We were bussed out to the Eldorado, Bonanza, and Gold Bottom Creek tributaries of the Klondike River to view gold mining areas. nuggets were first discovered in Eldorado Creek in 1896. Piles and piles of dredged rock were noticeably present today. Most gold is found on top of bedrock which can be 25 feet below the surface. When panning, gold flakes are 19 times more dense than soil, so they fall to the bottom of the pan. All you prospectors know that!

Eventually, large companies came in and bought most of the claims. Floating dredges stopped operating in the mid 50's. Afterwards dredging was done with backhoe equipment which was not very efficient in picking up small gold flakes.





Current physical resources use "shifters, rocker and sluice boxes" to isolate flakes from the soil. Now you have something new to store in your brain.
