ENROLLMENT BEGINS

4-H enrollment for 2018 in Indiana began October 1 and will continue through January 15, 2018.

4-H families are encouraged to join online at www.extension.purdue.edu/wells

If families do not have access to a computer or would prefer to complete a paper enrollment form, they should stop by the Wells County Extension Office located at the 4-H Park in Bluffton. For questions, call 824-6412.

4-H members must re-enroll each year for 4-H membership. The enrollment fee for Wells County is \$20 per youth with a maximum of \$60 per family. Scholarships are available upon request. Mini 4-H membership is fee. Some clubs, such as BB & Rifle have a supply fee to help cover extra costs.

Families may pay with a credit card when completing the enrollment online or they pay with cash or a check payable to Purdue Extension Ed Fund – Wells County at the Wells County Extension Office.

Youth may join Mini 4-H when they are in grades K – 2. They may select one of the projects that include: Collections, Crafts, Dinosaurs, Farm Animals, Foods, Horse & Pony, Models, My Pet & Me, Plants & Flowers, Rabbit, Sewing, and Whales &

Dolphins. It is free to join Mini 4-H.

Regular 4-H is for youth in grades 3 – 12. They may select projects from a list of 65. These range from Aerospace (rockets) to Woodworking.

Some 4-H projects begin in January, such as BB & Rifle, Robotics, Beef, Dairy Beef, and Horse & Pony. The various clubs will begin to meet in February and March and project workshops will begin.

The 4-H Fair will be held July 14 – 19 in 2018.


