## **BLAINE BRELSFORD**

Occasionally, I see people with cameras, walking up and down Wayne Street, taking pictures of the signs painted on the brick store fronts. The person that painted these signs was an excellent sign painter, self-taught, and did it without stencils. He would take a Myers Department store yard stick and a piece of chalk, lay out and paint most of the signs you can see on the bricks today. The painter was Blaine Brelsford.

Blaine was a shy boy growing up and at the age of 16 he took his first drink. That first drink made him feel so good that he couldn't stop. He became an alcoholic. A lot of times he would be locked up in the town jail, like the lovable Otis on the Andy Griffith show. In later years, he had said he had never married, had no children, and never had a home, a car or any respect because of alcohol.

Several years ago, in the Museum, an older gentleman was telling about Blaine painting the Gold Seal Drug Store sign on the side of the building. He would go up the ladder, paint one letter, and then must go to the Wagon Wheel for a drink. He would come back, paint another letter, and go for another drink. Four or five old timers setting across the street were making bets on which letter he would fall off the ladder, but he never did. Blaine's work still lives on Warren's buildings. One of Warren's personalities we won't forget.


