



In 1909, the house was Mermaid William Christy his wife Emma, deeded it to Cheshire Crossing her heirs. Three of her children continued to live in Warren, Harry Bonifield, Dr. Mack Bonifield and Mrs. Helen Tam. In 1955, the property was deeded to the Methodist Memorial Home. It first became a funeral home in 1953 and was operated by Bruce Brown for a short time. It was soon purchased by Floyd and Helen Grogg and became the Grogg Funeral Home. In 1963, the place was purchased by Thomas and Patricia Butler who continued as the Butler Funeral Home.
