Celebrate the 200th anniversary of the ghoulish birth of Edgar Allan Poe at the Pulse Opera House in Warren, Indiana. The noted writer of mystery and macabre was born in 1809 and in this bicentennial year of his birth the Pulse Opera House is presenting an adaptation of

three of his works in the radio readers theatre production of "Night Chills". The adaptation by Billy St. John features three classic works of Edgar Allan Poe including "The Tell Tale Heart", "The Fall of the House of Usher", and "The Cask of Amontillado". "The Tell Tale Heart" is a classic Poe's tale where the murderer is driven insane by the still beating heart of the slain victim. "The Fall of the House of Usher" takes place in a crumbling manor where Roderick Usher's ailing and assumed dead sister has been entombed, and the manor is suffering the same fate as its owner, death and decay. "The Cask of Amontillado" is the story of a father placing his family's honor over his daughter's happiness by luring her suitor to his entombment and death with a taste of the finest sherry wine.

A citizen in attendance asked Council to sign a Resolution changing the former Harvey Trailer Court from residential to commercial status. Storage units are to be established there.

It was reported that the Garfield statute is to be returned to the Library lawn soon.

Council will be advertising for trash pick-up bids. Bids are to be opened at the December 2 meeting.

The Fire Department is reported to be in need of new pagers. Council agreed to the request.

Halloween Trick or Treat hours will be on Halloween night, Saturday, October 31 from 6 to

9 p.m. Trick or Treaters are asked to only go to houses with porch lights on.

On the previous night, Friday, at 7 p.m., the Fort Wayne Astronomical Society will teach guests about the night sky and how to look through the telescopes.



In 1932, H.L.McLaughlin, representing the Indiana Highway was in Warren securing the right of way for State Road Five to be paved that summer. In August of that year, Irving Brothers of Fort Wayne began setting up their sand and stone equipment for the job. The underbrush was cut away and a huge tank was erected to wash the gravel. This was set up on the old Morrison farm southeast of town.

A quarry was being tested on the Glen Spahr farm down along the river. Workmen began drilling holes in the field to test the stone. The stone there was condemned by the Highway Commission so they used just out of the Morrison field. It was said the Irving Brothers used three tons of dynamite which was tamped down sixty holes. Most everyone in Warren heard the explosion.

A lot of big equipment was moved in the second week of August. Three big companies were to do the job and each used a lot of machinery. Irving Brothers was in charge of getting the gravel and stone out and running it through the washer. In another location, the Grace Company was set up to prepare the concrete to be spread on the road. The third company, The McElroy Construction Company, was in charge of making the grade. Part of the companies outfit was a drove of about sixty mules. This outfit had a camp somewhere in the neighborhood of the Four Mile Cemetery.

The McElroy Company employed a number of men to

build the grade using shovels. It required about 30 men to do the work. The stretch of road to be done ran from Four Mile Cemetery to the Huntington/ Wells county line south of Warren. More next week.





In the early years, profits from the dinner were used to supplement the Church Building Fund. For the last few years after the Fellowship Hall church debt was retired, net supper proceeds were used for other church projects and the Small World Nursery School which is now a tenant of the church.

After being challenged by Pastor Bill Fisher last year to "creatively practice your faith" and in consideration of the tough economic times, the Church decided to make the 2009 Fish & Tenderloin dinner a totally "free" experience for the people of Warren. Fundraising and planning started in November.

The theme of the event was "Follow the Fish" and Ephesians 2:10 was the signature verse and mission statement for the planning. On the first Sunday in June, every congregation member was given an unlimited number of tickets to give away to anyone they chose. Over the next 30 days, more than 1400 tickets were distributed to Warren area residents. The tickets and all advertisement still carried an \$8 price tag and no one was to be told prior to July 4 that costs for the meal were being underwritten by the members of the Church. It was also decided that any person who came to the door of the Church on July 4 to purchase a ticket, would be told that there would be no charge and the meal was "on us" this year.

On July 4, 1442 free meals were served to the community. In 2008, the event served 461 total dinners, so this was a more than 3 times increase in the number of contacts the church had with Warren area citizens. More than 100 members of the church family worked the day of the project and each received a blessing in stepping out in faith and doing "good works" for the Warren community.

For those patrons who wanted to pay something for their meal, three separate buckets were available for contribution. On the day of the event, the donations totaled \$2,805.12 with each charitable group receiving the amount that was placed in their designated bucket plus an additional \$500 donation from the church to both the Small World Nursery School and the Bread of Life Food Pantry and an additional \$1,000 to the Tippecanoe Baptist Camp located in North Webster, Indiana.
