On Wednesday, April 29, the Alzheimer's Association Greater Indiana Chapter is hosting a panel of dementia experts from 6 to 7:30 p.m., at Indiana University Purdue University Fort Wayne, in the International Ballroom, located at 2101 E. Coliseum Blvd. These experts will share information and answer questions from family members and professionals in an open forum setting. The panel will consist of Dr. Fen Lei Chang and Dr. Ron Williams from Fort Wayne Neurological Center, Lori Stock from Alzheimer's Association Greater Indiana Chapter, elder law attorney Keith Huffman and Maureen Widner from Aging and In-Home Services.

"This panel event will provide vital information about all aspects of dementia and the resources available to deal with it, as well as, the opportunity for attendees to ask questions to a group of dementia experts from a variety of disciplines, says Dustin Ziegler, Alzheimer's Association Greater Indiana Chapter Senior Specialist, Provider and Early Stage Outreach.

Today, more than 5 million Americans have Alzheimer's disease - the nation's sixth leading cause of death and the only

Rolled Oats Muffin

1 1/2 cups rolled oats and 1 cup milk, let set for about 15 minutes, add 1/2 cup orange juice, 1/2 cup oil, mix well, add 1/2 cup brown sugar, blend 1 1/2 cup flour, 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, 3/4 teaspoon soda, add to the mixture. If desired add nuts or raisins, dried cranberries or other dried fruit. Put into lined muffins tins bake 20 minutes at 350.

cause of death among the top 10 in the U.S. without a way to prevent, cure or even slow its progression. That number is expected to be as much as triple by 2050. In Indiana alone, there are more than 110,000 Hoosiers living with Alzheimer's disease. Approximately 332,000 friends and family members manage the significant emotional, physical and financial challenges of caregiving for their loved ones living with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia.

LIFEGUARD TESTING

Lifeguarding tests are online for applicants seeking positions at Indiana State Parks facilities during the 2015 recreation season.

The test is for first-year applicants only. First-year applicants must pass the test as part of the job application. Candidates who have already worked at a state park facility are exempt from this requirement.

The test is 50 questions, with approximately half of the test covering CPR and first aid, and half covering lifeguarding knowledge and training. The successful applicant must score at least 70 percent.

A link to the test and application information for both first-year and returning candidates are at stateparks.IN.gov/lifeguardtest.

Applicants must be certified in lifeguarding and CPR for the professional rescuer before taking the test. If an applicant is enrolled in a certification class but has yet to finish, he or she may take the test but must complete certification before being eligible for employment.

Passing the test qualifies a certified applicant to be considered for a lifeguard position with Indiana State Parks and does not recertify a lifeguard. Lifeguards must maintain valid certifications on their own. Certification course work may be obtained through the Red Cross or at YMCA locations offering the program and must be completed before swim season.

The swim season generally runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Hiring will begin immediately. Positions are available at Brown County, Clifty Falls, Versailles, Spring Mill, Harmonie, O'Bannon Woods, McCormick's

Creek, Ouabache, Mounds, Indiana Dunes, Shakamak, Turkey Run and Prophetstown state parks, and Lieber State Recreation Area.

Then there is the guy or gal who calls a mark purporting to be a health care provider who needs your Social Security number and other personal information. Don't fall for it, says AMAC. These identity thieves use the info for a variety of illegal purposes, including Medicare fraud.

The moral of this story is "don't be so ready to fork over money or personal details of your life to just anybody; a little doubt can go a long way toward protecting yourself from fraudsters."

THE CURIOUS CATS OF AOSHIMA

Some time ago the residents of the tiny island of Aoshima off the Japanese coast imported cats to help rid themselves of pesky mice that had overrun their community. It worked.
