## THE **U**PTOWN GARDENER

by Ruth Herring On this day of writing it has been Fathers Day and I

hope all you Dads had a great day. At our house it was a very nice time even though they couldn't get the grill started, but that didn't stop the hamburgers and other good stuff from being prepared.

So far as the garden it is barren but I did manage to get a couple tomato plants and a short row of beans in the ground next to the garage. Perhaps I no longer, at least this year, qualify as a gardener. I have been enjoying the flower beds and the porch boxes and most of all my new patio. I certainly intend to spend a lot of time there this summer.

I was cruising the internet and became interested in the stories of the old flour sack and feed bags. My mom didn't get very much in the flour bags but I can remember drying dishes on towels that had advertising from someplace. Also both Mom and Dad saved the string off the bags to have for many purposes. I remember visiting some of their farm friends and the lady had a huge ball of string and she crochet doilies and other pretty things with it. Flour bags were used for many things from dish towels, casings for feather pillows, diapers, underwear (that never wore out). I can remember Mom making a little bag to keep crayons, pencils and other small things in for school that we tied onto the side of our desk. My name was printed on it that she carefully did with her fountain pen in permanent ink.

The best part of those glorious ole feed bags was when I got to go to the elevator with dad to pick out the printed bags for me a new dress. When I was smaller it took only one for a dress and as I grew Dad had to buy feed for 2 weeks so I would have matching material for a dress. The only time I remember Mom going with us was when she needed a new apron. Those old aprons really stood up to the task.

I found on the internet you could purchase 2 matching bags from \$15.00 to \$20.00. I figured in my day we had to buy the feed for chickens so the material was free a pattern was about 20 cents, if you really needed one and a spool of thread was 5 cents. So that was a good deal and if you didn't grow too fast, you wore it a longtime. If someone asked what kind of material it was you told them it was chicken linen. (American made)

Yes it was a good thing when someone came up with the idea of being able to go to the feed store to buy quality material. The whole idea had been around for many years and was a staple in many homes whether you lived in towns or farms, but the printed feed bags was a hot item about in the early 30's and lasted several years.

Next week I will get back with a recipe till then enjoy summer.

#### **CANNER TESTING**

The Purdue Cooperative Extension Service of Wells County is offering a week this

summer to have your pressure canner tested by a certified canner tester. A new method of testing canners has been developed by the Presto Canner Company and the Purdue CFS Educators is now certified to test pressure canners. Dial gauge canners should be checked annually for accuracy. Weighted gauge canners do not need to be tested.

Two different inspections are available:

\*Gauge/LidInspection only for \$3.00. The dial gauge will be tested for accuracy and the petcock and gasket will be checked for cracks and condition.

\* Full canner inspection for \$5.00. Includes the dial gauge, the safety plug, petcock and gasket and the overall condition of the canner.

The testingdates are beingheld in the Wells County Community Center at the 4-H Park, 1240 S. 4-H Road, Bluffton, during the week of June 27th to July 1st. Bring your lid or entire canner and make arrangements to leave it and pick it up at a later date during the week. The hours the Extension Office is open are: 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM. No canners or lids will be accepted after 12:00 Noon on July 1st.

A free publication entitled, "Using and Caring for Your Pressure Canner" will also be available to those bringing a canner or lid in for inspection.

#### SWARMING BEES

Summer is approaching so folks are spending more time noticing nature. Swarms of honey bees can suddenly appear this time of the year and cause alarm for some people.

Timothy Gibb, an Insect

Diagnostician with Purdue University, has written a brief update on honey bees which can be found on the Purdue Plant and Pest Laboratory Web (http:// www.ppdl.purdue.edu/PPDL/ weeklypics/6-13-11.html). Gibb says that these swarms should be less of a threat to people now because they do not have a hive to defend. Bees will not be very aggressive until they have foundalocation for a new hive. So, in most situations when a honey bee swarm is found on a tree, shrub or house, no action is required. Gibb reminds us that swarms are almost always temporary and the bees will

It is important to remember that honey bees are very beneficial insects to the environment, and spraying is not usually recommended to control them. The pure sweet taste of honey is just one of the manyfoodsthatcomefromthe activities of bees. They often play an important role in the pollination of crops. Some plants cannot produce fruit without the assistance of bees

move on within hours, or at most

a few days, if you patiently

ignore them.

in pollination. Just to name a few – almonds from trees in California, blueberries from bushes in Michigan, and melons from vines in Indiana.

> The Huntington County Extension Office receives calls every summer about hives that people have found on their property. Unfortunately there are times when bees become a pest because they are building a colony near a home or other buildings. This can be a serious problem, and the bees can cause structural damage as well as annoy those who live in or near the building.

A Purdue publication by Tim Gibb and Ralph Williams, Social Bees and Wasps (http:// extension.entm.purdue.edu/ publications/E-44.pdf) discusses suggestions for this problem. It may be possible to inject 5% carbaryl dust (Sevin) into the entrance holes in structures as noted in the publication. However, many times it is best to contact a beekeeper or pest control professional.

Some beekeepers have posted their information on-line in regards to removing honey bee swarms. Indiana beekeeper information can be found by

clicking "Swarm Call List" at the Indiana Beekeepers' Association website: http:// www.indianabeekeeper.com/.

Honeybees are interesting creatures to watch, and most of the time they are helping us rather than being a pest. We should try to just leave them alone so they can do their work. #### LIFELINE & LINK UP ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

An eligible customer may receive the Lifeline discount on either a wireline or wireless phone, but the discount is available for only one telephone service per household.

Link Up Assistance provides a credit for up to one half (1/2) of the new service connection charges for telecommunications service. This credit is only available on the installation of a single residential access line at the principal residence of the eligible customer. A customer may receive the Link Up discount only once per address.


