The first Theater was named Star Theater. In 1907, it was located at the Reome Building on First Street where Smekens Education is now located. The movies were called "Illustrated Songs and Moving Pictures". They had excellent responses to the movies and they decided to make a stay in Warren.

The first owner was George Gilbert, who sold the Theater 5 KEYS TO HELPING YOUR to the Star Company which was owned by Milton Bock and a partner and then Milton Bock bought the interest of his partner. Milton Bock moved the theater to the Huffman building where




