RALSTON SUPPORTS NAVY

A 1993 Lakeview Christian School graduate and Warren, Indiana, native in the U.S. Navy supports the nation's nuclear deterrence mission. Senior Chief Petty Officer Jeremy Ralston is a Navy aviation electronics technician serving with Fleet Air Reconnaissance Squadron 4, a versatile command operating E6-B Mercury aircraft under USSTRATCOM operational control providing a survivable and endurable airborne communications link to the nation's strategic forces.

Ralston is a 2009 graduate of Purdue University and is responsible for admiration of the command maintenance department and training junior officers and personnel.

Ralston credits success in the Navy to many of the lessons learned growing up in Warren.

"Growing up in a small town meant you had to learn how to get things done yourself and often think outside the box," said Ralston. "My parents were very good at teaching us all different skills which has benefited me during my Navy career."

The mission stems from the original 1961 Cold War order known as 'Take Charge and Move Out!' Adapted as TACAMO and now the command's nickname, today, the men and women of TACAMO continue to provide a survivable communication link between national decision makers and the nation's nuclear weapons.

The commander-in-chief issues orders to members of the military who operate nuclear weapons aboard submarines, aircraft or in land-based missile silos. Sailors aboard TACAMO E-6 Mercury aircraft provide the one-of-a-kind and most-survivable communication needed for this critical mission.

"Serving here is one piece of the puzzle in the Navy and having served in many different theaters and platforms has helped me understand what this piece does," said Ralston.

The Navy's presence aboard an Air Force base in the middle of America may seem like an odd location given its distance from any ocean; however, the central location allows for the deployment of aircraft to both coasts and the Gulf of Mexico on a moment's notice. This quick response is key to the success of the nuclear deterrence mission.

CAR TRIPS WITH THE KIDS DON'T HAVE TO BE STRESSFUL

It's hot and your family is heading for a fun vacation destination, but there's still that long car ride that has to happen first. And no, a car with unhappy, complaining children isn't the best way to get that vacation off to a great start.

While children usually get excited about the upcoming getaway, they also have a low level of patience and are easily bored sitting in a car. How to minimize the stress a car trip can bring for both parents and children?

Start by being prepared. Are the tires in good shape, the air conditioning working, oil levels checked and the gas tank full? Get it all done before loading the kids in the car and before risking a break down on a busy freeway.

When the trip starts, don't give the children a chance to be bored. Assemble a package of books and magazines, favorite electronics and chargers, and downloaded music and movies that will keep the kiddos entertained. And no, don't give them everything at once. Parcel out fun items over time to help break up the trip rather than having them run through it all in the first hour.

This doesn't mean you let the kids bury themselves in their cell phones or portable video games the whole trip. Have regular breaks that get the kids talking. Get a road map or map book and let them find out where they currently are, some nearby attractions, and where they're still heading.

Remember that kids need to eat, and often on a schedule that's different from Mom and Dad's. Pack a bag with small containers of healthy and filling snacks. Take time to stop for a quick lunch if the kids are really starving.

And begin with the goal of making the trip itself interesting. While it can be tempting to just push on to that destination, a better idea is to find some places for short stops, especially if it's a long car trip. Five minutes at a scenic overlook, or a short visit to a small town and its local ice cream shop can help break up the travel and give everyone a chance to stretch and sometimes even discover something interesting.

Yes, you want to reach that destination, but make the ride an enjoyable part of the whole trip and you'll add to everyone's experience.

His son, John Howard Senior, came to Huntington County in 1839. Passing through much wilderness he finally settled in 1840 in the northwest quarter of Section 13 in Salamonie Township.

On his land was a large teepee from the Miami Indians. He tore that down and established a log cabin. He was a poor, but honest

man who raised a large family and now in 2019 we are celebrating the Thompson family heritage!

CHIP & SEAL BEGINS

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) recently announced they will begin chip and seal preservation today on various roadways, including locations in Huntington County.

Drivers can expect lane restrictions and traffic directed by flaggers at State Road 218 between State Road 3 in Huntington County and State Road 1 in Wells County, as well as at U.S. 224 between State Road 5 and just west of I-69 in Huntington County.

In an effort to update and improve our cable TV system, Citizens Telephone/Warren Cable will be moving all channels to a digital format. Currently all channels are in analog format and several are rebroadcast in a clear digital format. What this means to you is that you must have a "digital ready" TV, not an older analog style. If you have a newer TV all you need to do is rescan your channels after we have made the switch.

Steps to determine if your TV is "digital" or "analog":

1. Consider the age of your television. If your TV was made after March 1, 2007, it must include a digital tuner to be in compliance with a FCC rule prohibiting the manufacture of any device containing an analog tuner unless it also contained a digital tuner. If your TV was purchased any earlier than 2007, it more than likely is an analog TV.
2. Look for an HDTV logo on the front of your TV. A digital TV will most always have something that will identify it as digital. The label could also have a marker containing the words "Integrated Digital Tuner", "Digital Tuner Built-in", "Digital Receiver", "DTV" or "NTSC". Our cable system is "NTSC". If you cannot find any one of these logos, it is more than likely an analog TV.
3. Digital TV's are also lighter in weight and most have a flat screen. The analog TV's are much heavier and larger in size because of the CRT (Cathode Ray Tube).

After determining what style of TV you have, there are a couple of things you must do after we make the switch to all digital. If you already have a digital TV it will be necessary for you to run your channel scan option found in the menu or setup option in your TV. This will automatically find all the digital channels and save them for you. If you go shopping for a new TV, make sure it has a coaxial input. If it does not, you are only purchasing a monitor. It cannot be called a TV unless it has a tuner built in. **If you determine that you are still watching on an analog TV, please call our office prior to the switch date for options available to you.**

Please note that after scanning, some of the channels may move to different locations in the lineup. We will have new Channel Lineups available once we have made the switch. In some instances, we will not know ahead of schedule where the receiver will "tune-in" to the digital location. Please be aware that during this upgrade, several of the channels will be unavailable throughout the process.

We will be making this switch on Monday July 29th. Please plan ahead and be prepared. We will continue to post updates on our Facebook page, Channel 8 and the Warren Weekly. As always, Citizens Telephone & Warren Cable are here to assist you in any way that we can.

structures and fires that were spawned.

That earthquake raised the ground level in the area. It filled in a large lagoon and created a higher, solid terrain for rebuilding. The community came together as many employees and volunteers helped reconstruct 400 buildings in three years. The new appearance is an "Art Deco" style and is recognized worldwide.

We previously selected an area excursion on the "Hawke's Bay Express." This form of transportation was a two-car, trolley-style vehicle. It was not air conditioned, but with the 62 degree outside temperature, the comfort level was perfect for site-seeing.

Napier appeared to be a very comfortable living area with mild winters and warm summers. Many people retire here. The region is very fertile, agriculturally that is! Dairy products, timber, meat, apples and wine are their main exports.

They have canning factories for corn and other vegetables.

More than one crop plantings are normal with mild weather and an aquifer beneath.

The city supplied round trip, shuttle bus service to the business district which included a grid of several blocks. All merchants were very busy with the tourist business today. We hopped off the trolley vehicle downtown but did not stray far from the shuttle bus pick up area on Marine Parade Street. However we did spend some New Zealand currency for a few souvenirs at a nearby, gift shop.

Some interesting features of the day included seeing a "Toothbrush" tree with its branches adorned with multiple, green twigs turned upwards; a sign stating, "Gin is Liquid Sanity;" and the tour guide requesting that everyone take home a souvenir—a "Local Politician." Politicians serve fairly short terms in Australia and New Zealand. Also, tobacco is

forbidden to be advertised! But years earlier, tobacco workers were given free cigarettes as a "Health Benefit."

The Maori name for New Zealand is Aotearoa.

The words for today are:

"Bach(pronounced, Bath) which means, "Beach House;"

"Crib" which refers to the South Island;

"Kiaora" which means, "Hello;"

"Naumai" which is, "Welcome," and

"Ka kite ano" which says, "Good Bye."

TICK SEASON: AN OUNCE OF PREVENTION IS WORTH A POUND OF CURE

- Cover up if you will be spending time in bushy or wooded areas or wandering through fields of tall grass. Wear long sleeves and tuck your long pants into your socks -- while this look would be frowned upon by the fashion-conscious, it may, literally, save your life!

- Once home, check your clothes and body for ticks, and don't forget some of the not-so-obvious places, like your scalp, belly button and underarms.
