NEW BLOOD TEST FOR HEART ATTACKS HELPS TO SHORTEN ER WAIT TIMES

(BPT) - Waiting in an emergency room frustrates patients across the country. Billboards are even popping on local highways advertising the wait time and a promise for faster care.
