## BROWN NAMED 2017 PIONEER

This year's winner is a native Warrenite who spent his early years in this building and probably spent interesting times in this very room while using the library or working on class assignments in study hall. More than that, through the years as a Cub Scout and Boy Scout, running a paper route, serving as a soda jerk at Coolman's, and working

with his Dad Archie at the Texaco station, he developed a kinship to the people of the Town and surrounding area which lasts until today.

Graduating from Warren High School in 1965 he went to work for Citizen's Telephone Company. However, as with many young men of the time, he was drafted and sent to basic training at Fort Campbell, Ky. Serving a tour in Vietnam starting in 1967, he returned to Warren and Citizen's Telephone in 1969. But his service to local citizens did not end there.

Wendell Brown, you are this year's Samuel Jones Pioneer Award Winner.

Marrying Shari Sue Thompson in 1971, Wendell settled into life in Warren once again. Enrolling full time IPFW in 1973 and painting houses to provide for the family, he graduated with an Associate Degree in Electrical Engineering in 1975 and went to work for Triad Utrad until the company relocated to Alabama in 1996. He then went to Wabash Technologies until that company closed, approximately one year ago.

However during those years he was also volunteering as a coach of Little and Pony League for eight years and as chair of the Salamonie Festival Parade Committee for three years and those years also saw the birth of his son Broc. In 1972, a visit from Forrest Pond, then Warren Fire Chief, resulted in Wendell joining the Fire Department where he has continued service until the present, serving in almost every level of the Department and of the Warren Firemen's Association.

In 1978, Wendell completed training to become an EMT and served with Tri Township Ambulance for twenty years working twenty four hour shifts on the weekend, filling in for others, and being dedicated to the unit. When Tri Township was dissolved as Huntington Hospital was to

This summer, visitors will find sweet onions, red and gold potatoes, sugar snap peas, cabbage, broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, kohlrabi, peppers, tomatoes, okra, green beans, beets, herbs, kale, lettuce, cucumbers, zucchini, yellow summer squash, acorn and butternut squashes, and eggplant planted at the garden. It has been a challenging spring with the excessive rainfall, but Extension staff and volunteers are doing their best to bring the Huntington Community a garden full of delicious, nutritious fresh vegetables.
