As they say "time goes fast when you are having fun", really can't say that about all of those years, but most of them. There was 13 in our graduating class and 4 or 5 are still with us.

Last writing I mentioned my moms recipe for ice cream and couldn't find it but finally did hidden between pages and it is so old and spotted can hardly make it out but here it goes. v 6 beaten eggs, 1 1/2 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cornstarch, V mixed well together add about 2 cups milk and cook on medium heat till sugar is well dissolved and begins to thicken slightly remove from stove add 1 tablespoon vanilla, let cool (she would do this part early in day to let cool covered in refrigerator and I remember quite a few times it was cooling in the old ice box) when ready to start the freezing pour it into the freezer container and add a pint of good cows cream and finish filling it about 2/3 full with milk. 1st Worship......8:30 a.m. Freeze according to the type freezer you have. We had an old White mountain wood barrel freezer you hand cranked. Dad got ice from the ice house that was a big block and would put it in a gunny sack and beat it to crush it into small pieces and used salt with it, he knew exactly what portions of salt and ice to make it come out perfect. This made about 1 1/2 gallons. Mom would make up chocolate syrup or sometimes caramel to pour over it and if strawberries were in season that was mighty tasty too and always had cake or pie to go

It was fun to spread a blanket and go out under the huge maple tree and have a real family time. Good memories and good food.

ORV HELMET LAW

Effective July 1, state law will require children under age 18 to wear an approved helmet when riding any off-road vehicle (ORV) on public or private property in Indiana, including Interlake Redbird state recreation areas

House Enrolled Act 1200, which was signed into law by Gov. Eric J. Holcomb on April 26, means changes to the rules at the two off-roadriding properties owned and operated by the Department Resources, of Natural Interlake. Redbird and Redbird SRA is near Linton,

and Interlake SRA is near in order to access the Lynnville.

Both properties previously to wear approved helmets riding vehicles (ATVs) and dirt bikes but not when riding side-byside ORVs equipped with roll and to maximize safety of bars or overhead protection. children, HEA 1200 applies to both Interlake property manager ATVs and side-by-side ORVs. Carman Jackson recommends The new law will add the customers acquire approved requirement that children in children's helmets and have side-by-side ORVs approved helmets.

Currently the DNR riding properties do not require helmets before July 1 will children or adults to wear approved helmets when riding side-by-side ORVs, but DNR recommends everyone wear approved helmets when doing any off- weight of the helmet before road riding.

of ORVs who allow children younger than age 18 to ride their ORV on public or private property without wearing an approved helmet can be charged with a Class C infraction, which carries a maximum penalty of \$500.

"Approved helmets" are that those meet Department οf Transportation standards.

Redbird and Interlake will not have helmets available for borrow or rent. Visitors who want their children to be allowed to ride ATVs at those properties will need to bring the proper amount of approved helmets with them

Once inside either property, required children and adults violators of the new law will be subject to penalties, as all-terrain well as expulsion from the property.






