Spring, winter which is it? My patience is slowly running out. My roof partner and I finally got most of the flower bed planted that we share jointly and is looking good, hopefully it doesn't suffer from the frost we have had. Been wanting to get some annuals planted but just not been warm enough yet, but they do add a bit of cheer in the garage sitting there waiting patiently to be outside.

Not much has been happening to write about, did go to the Andrews alumni this past weekend, had a nice time meeting classmates and some of the older class members, hard to believe I have been out of high school 65 years. As they say "time goes fast when you are having fun", really can't say that about all of those years, but most of them. There was 13 in our graduating class and 4 or 5 are still with us.

Last writing I mentioned my moms recipe for ice cream and couldn't find it but finally did hidden between pages and it is so old and spotted can hardly make it out but here it goes.

6 beaten eggs, 1 1/2 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cornstarch, mixed well together add about 2 cups milk and cook on medium heat till sugar is well dissolved and begins to thicken slightly remove from stove add 1 tablespoon vanilla, let cool (she would do this part early in day to let cool covered in refrigerator and I remember quite a few times it was cooling in the old ice box) when ready to start the freezing pour it into the freezer container and add a pint of good cows cream and finish filling it about 2/3 full with milk. Freeze according to the type freezer you have. We had an old White mountain wood barrel freezer you hand cranked. Dad got ice from the ice house that was a big block and would put it in a gunny sack and beat it to crush it into small pieces and used salt with it, he knew exactly what portions of salt and ice to make it come out perfect. This made about 1 1/2 gallons. Mom would make up chocolate syrup or sometimes caramel to pour over it and if strawberries were in season that was mighty tasty too and always had cake or pie to go with it.

It was fun to spread a blanket and go out under the huge maple tree and have a real family time. Good memories and good food.

STAMP OUT HUNGER

On Saturday, May 13, the National Association of Letter Carriers, the United States Postal Service & other partners are asking the community of Warren, IN to Stamp Out Hunger. This is the 25th anniversary of the food drive, which has grown into a national effort that provides assistance to the millions of Americans struggling to help put food on the table.

The Stamp Out Hunger food drive, held on the 2nd Saturday in May, has become the nation's largest single-day food drive. In 2016, generous Americans donated 80.1 million pounds of food, feeding millions of people. This was the 13th consecutive year of at least 70 million pounds collected by letter carriers, bringing the grand total to 1.5 billion pounds of food collected, since the Food Drive began in 1993.

"We are proud to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the food drive," said Acting Postmaster, Theresa Sprong. "We're asking residents for their support to help make this another successful year.

It's easy to make a donation: simply leave a bag of nonperishable food items by the mailbox to help your neighbors in need."

The need for food assistance exists in every

community in America. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, 50 million Americans are food insecure, meaning they live at risk of hunger. Perhaps most alarming is the fact that nearly 16 million children in America are struggling with hunger. Additionally, close to 5 million seniors face choices between paying rent, utilities, and having nutritious food.

To participate in the annual Stamp Out Hunger food drive residents are encouraged to leave a sturdy bag containing nonperishable food items such as canned soup, canned vegetables, peanut butter, pasta, rice or cereal next to their mailbox prior to the time of regular mail delivery on Saturday, May 13. Letter carriers will collect these food donations as they deliver the mail and take them to local food banks.

ESSAY CONTEST

ORV HELMET LAW

Effective July 1, state law will require children under age 18 to wear an approved helmet when riding any off-road vehicle (ORV) on public or private property in Indiana, including Interlake and Redbird state recreation areas.

House Enrolled Act 1200, which was signed into law by Gov. Eric J. Holcomb on April 26, means changes to the rules at the two off-road-riding properties owned and operated by the Department of Natural Resources, Redbird and Interlake. Redbird SRA is near Linton,

and Interlake SRA is near Lynnville.

Both properties previously required children and adults to wear approved helmets when riding all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and dirt bikes but not when riding side-by-side ORVs equipped with roll bars or overhead protection. HEA 1200 applies to both ATVs and side-by-side ORVs. The new law will add the requirement that children in side-by-side ORVs wear approved helmets.

Currently the DNR riding properties do not require children or adults to wear approved helmets when riding side-by-side ORVs, but the DNR recommends everyone wear approved helmets when doing any off-road riding.

Under the new law, owners of ORVs who allow children younger than age 18 to ride their ORV on public or private property without wearing an approved helmet can be charged with a Class C infraction, which carries a maximum penalty of \$500.

"Approved helmets" are those that meet U.S. Department of Transportation standards.

Redbird and Interlake will not have helmets available for borrow or rent. Visitors who want their children to be allowed to ride ATVs at those properties will need to bring the proper amount of approved helmets with them

in order to access the properties.

Once inside either property, violators of the new law will be subject to penalties, as well as expulsion from the property.

To prepare for the change and to maximize safety of children, Redbird and Interlake property manager Carman Jackson recommends customers acquire approved children's helmets and have their children start wearing them before July 1.

"Having children wear helmets before July 1 will allow plenty of time to figure out the correct sizing for children's helmets and for children's neck muscles to acclimate to supporting the weight of the helmet before getting into the hilly terrain at our properties," Jackson said.

The new law does not affect the riders of snowmobiles, which do not fall under the legal definition of ORV per Indiana Code 14-8-2-185.

FIREWOOD RULE

With the arrival of camping season, visitors to DNR properties should brush up on the DNR firewood rule.

The rule helps protect Indiana's trees from the 140 known pests and pathogens that currently affect forests as well as pests we don't know about yet. Several pests and pathogens are

transported through firewood movement.

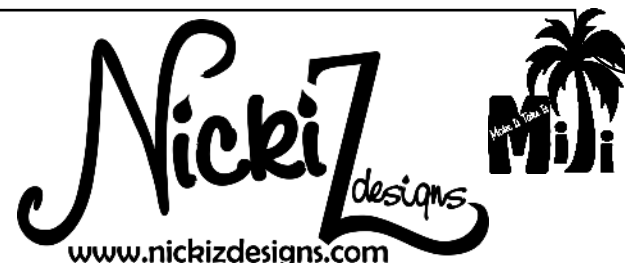
Under the rule, visitors to state parks, reservoirs, state forests and state fish & wildlife areas can bring firewood from home—as long as the bark has been removed. Removing the bark minimizes the risk of accidental infestation through firewood movement, because insect larvae live in sapwood under the bark.

Guests may also bring firewood into DNR properties, if it's:

- Kiln-dried scrap lumber.
- Purchased outside the property and bears either a USDA compliance stamp or a state compliance stamp.
- Purchased from the property campstore or on-site firewood vendor and has a state compliance stamp.

Regardless of where visitors get their firewood, they should burn it all at the campsite before they leave.

In short, the firewood rule means: "Buy it with a stamp, bring it debarked, burn it all."
