anyone, it's because someone else first was to me" stated Jarod.

"Mr. Hammel has done an outstanding job of building relationships with his students while at HNHS. He is able to show the "why" in the math concepts he is teaching to his students. He uses a variety of instructional strategies to help differentiate his instruction in order to reach all students. He has strong work ethic and a passion for teaching, as he is always looking for new strategies to help students learn. It is common for him to have students in his classroom before school to get help on math homework and others seek his advice on issues outside of school. He is a true professional and is

willing to help any staff member or student in any capacity. He truly is a servant leader. We are fortunate to have someone of his character leading our young people in Huntington County" explained Assistant Superintendent for Instruction Chad Daugherty.

Although this is Russ Degitz's first year as principal at Huntington North, he has known Jarod for a long time. He coached Jarod when he was a student-athlete at HNHS and went on to hire him as an assistant coach on his baseball staff. "Jarod is an educator and person of the highest caliber. The next step for Jarod will be an interview session with a committee consisting of previous Indiana Teacher of the Year recipients as well as other educational stakeholders.

PUBLIC LANDS DAYS

Show your appreciation for public lands by volunteering at an Indiana State Parks property on Saturday, Sept. 24.

That is National Public Lands Day, the nation's largest single-day volunteer effort for public lands. Volunteer opportunities will include lake cleanups at Brookville Lake and Pokagon State Park, trail work at Tippecanoe River and Turkey Run state parks, and gardening at Salamonie Lake and Lieber State Recreation Area.

Some properties also will offer volunteer opportunities on Sunday, Sept. 25.

But National Public Lands Day isn't all work and no play. Properties will offer hikes, pioneer activities, crafts and live bird shows, too.

National Public Lands Day activities for Indiana state parks are at stateparks.IN.gov/2443.htm.

While volunteers are welcome throughout the year, National Public Lands Day is one of four key times when Indiana State Parks volunteer and giving opportunities. The other days in which service and giving are emphasized are Giving Tuesday (Nov. 29), Martin Luther King National Day of Service (Jan. 16, 2017) and National Volunteer Week (April 23-29, 2017). In 2015, volunteers contributed

nearly 90,000 hours of service to state parks.
