Moving on to Regional Theater Festival

The Pulse Opera House in Warren won "Outstanding Performance" in the American Association of Community Theatre's Indiana AACTFest 2017 competition held March 18-19 at Kokomo Civic Theatre. The Pulse production of Nunsense also won trophies for Outstanding Direction (Cynthia Smyth-Wartzok), Outstanding Supporting Performance (Stacia Brinneman) and Outstanding Supporting Performance (Jana Henly). The Pulse was also recognized for Excellence in Ensemble Performance.

AACTfest is held in the odd-numbered years and provides an opportunity for community theatres nationwide to enter 60 minute cuttings of shows for adjudication and the chance to advance to regional and national festivals. Indiana is part of Region III which serves Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and Wisconsin. The regional festival will be held the weekend of April 28-30 in Champaign, Illinois. The national festival is June 26-July 1 in Rochester, Minnesota and features community theatre productions from across the country and the US Armed Services in Europe.

### COUNCIL MINUTES

The Town Council of the Town of Warren met Monday, March 20, 2017 at Assembly Hall, Council Meeting Room, 131 N. Wayne Street, in accordance with rules of Council and applicable law.

Those present were: Town Council, Ethan Stivers, Julia Glessner, Steve Buzzard, Tracey Brown; Clerk-Treasurer Marilyn Morrison; Employees, Lee Poulson, Dennis Spitler; Huntington County Tab reporter and others.

President Glessner announced the opening of the meeting at 5:00 pm.

Minutes of the meeting of February 13, 2017 were approved as submitted.

Mandy Wood, Director of Huntington County Department of Community Development, gave a synopsis of work necessary for development of a county wide FREP (Flood Response and Evacuation Plan) citing that Warren had previously dealt with flooding so somewhat of a plan already exists. An engineering firm has been hired by the County

to develop the plan which consists of assessment, analysis of data, and implementation. No schedule of completion was given.

Council reviewed a proposed contract with Commonwealth Engineering for consulting. The contract, as submitted, was the same as in the past two years. Following discussion, Glessner moved, seconded by Buzzard to approve. The motion was approved unanimously.

Morrison reported that a two year update of Fixed Asset data was being done by T.M. Wells Company, the original contractor. Wells will be working with the State Board of Accounts for more clarification on Electric Department purchases as to clarify operating costs and fixed asset costs and will be moving meter purchases to operating costs instead of fixed asset costs. The plan is maintained to meet State mandates. Morrison requested permission to hire a consultant to review and suggest corrections within the former Payroll Fund so that it can be closed out. The discrepancy has existed since the system was updated by Keystone Software. The consultant is a former employee of that company and has expertise in payroll software transfers. Stivers moved, seconded by Glessner, to approve the

contract at forty dollars an hour. The motion was approved unanimously. Greg Guerrettaz, Financial Consultant, will be on side on March 23rd for the annual review of records, project planning, and sustainability reporting.

Marshal Spitler submitted the monthly activity report for February and reported that the newly purchased squad car will be outfitted on Wednesday for street use. Discussion was held on sale of the 2006 Tahoe but no definite decision will be made until equipment is removed from the vehicle.

Poulson submitted the February activity report for the Warren Fire Department.

Poulson, as Utility Manager, reported that the ceiling at the Water Plant has not yet been repaired. The recently purchased BobCat is to be delivered in this week. The Second Street sidewalk and street light project planning has been completed. The project will see the installation of three lights on Second Street in an area where there has never been street lighting, installation of additional Electric Pedestals for use during Festivals, etc., and sidewalk replacement due to the need to have the project completed before the Summer Festival and to

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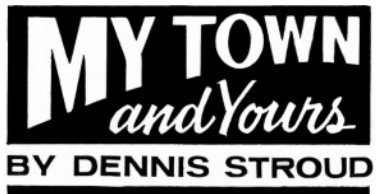
facilitate the start of the project, Glessner moved, seconded by Buzzard, to authorize Poulson and Morrison to review the quotes for the concrete work and assign the project. The motion was approved unanimously. As part of the project, four trees will need removed and Council accepted by consensus a quote from Tucker Tree Service in the amount of \$2150. Replacement trees will be planted when the project is complete.

The next Regular Meeting of Council has been rescheduled for April 17th.

**90TH BIRTHDAY**

Flossie Brown recently celebrated her 90th birthday with a surprise luncheon at the Country Post in Huntington with many of her nieces and great-nieces by her side. Her birthday was February 14th. For those that

From 1967 to 1981, the school held the township elementary in the building. In 1981, the school board decided to close the Warren School building. This prompted a group, from the area, to call a meeting January 6, 1982 to discuss the possibility of saving the school house building. Several meetings were held to decide what it can be used for and how to finance it.

In March of that year, the school board gave the group until September to come up with a plan or the building would be torn down. In April,

the group organized and formed a committee called W.A.R.R.E.N., which stands for Warren Area Residents for Recreational and Educational Needs. A contest was held to see if somebody, in the community had any good ideas to use the building as a community center.

With the utilities, heat, water and sewage, totaling \$15,000 to \$20,000 a year and the roof needing repaired the next agenda was the finances. A fund drive was planned. It was decided to ask for pledges to be paid over a three year period. The money raised would be put in a trust fund and the interest would be used to operate the building. The fund drive was started on July 1, 1982 and the goal was \$275,000.

In order for the school board to sell the building and property to a group, the group had to be a not-for-

profit organization. In July, 1982 the committee became W.A.R.R.E.N., Inc.

By the end of September the community had pledged \$125,000. Then along came Mr. Clifford Knight, owner and chairman of Addison Products Co. of Addison, Michigan. They manufactured refrigeration, heating and air conditioning, the maker of Weatherking Products. Mr. Knight was a former graduate of Warren High School.

Mr. Knight pledged \$125,000 to match what the community had pledged with \$80,000 of it coming for the first payment. A total of \$250,000 was pledged with a total of \$177,000 in the bank at that time.

The middle of October the school board transferred ownership to W.A.R.R.E.N., Inc. In return the group paid \$1.00 for the building and the property and agreed to set aside \$15,000 for a ten year

period to be used for demolition if the community center didn't work out.

October 1, 1982, the community center opened for business and on April 17, 1983 the Community Center was dedicated. At the dedication the building was named the Knight Civic Center after Mr. Knight.

At that time there was a five member group who oversees the building and grounds. They rented rooms, held programs and took care of maintenance. Most of the work has always been and still is volunteer.

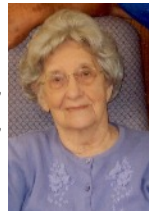
