# **DEADLINE APPROACHING**

Wells County 4-H members are busy finishing their project manuals and records (what can be completed) so that they can be checked (reviewed) by their 4-H Club Leader on or before July 1st. Once a member has their manual and record checked, the 4-H Club Leader will issue them a signed certificate stating they have completed the required activities. This certificate must be shown upon check in at the 4-H Fair Expo Hall (non livestock projects) and at the 4-H Park West Road (livestock projects). Alpaca, Dog, and Cat exhibits will be checked at their June workshop or club meeting. Members who do not have a signed certificate from their leader will not be able to check their 4-H projects in at the 4-H Fair.

Livestock members should complete as much of the livestock feed record sheet as they can. Once the 4-H Auction is finished, members will be able to finish their record and turn it into their club box at the 4-H Fair Office.

Mini 4-H member's rules remain the same. They simply complete their project exhibit and bring it to the 4-H Fair.

Club boxes will be on display in the Community Center for members to turn in the finished

Record Notebooks and folders during the 4-H Fair.

The Wells County 4-H Council along with the 4-H Association and 4-H Leaders all endorse the July 1st rule which helps encourage vouth to complete their entire project. # **OPERATION DRY WATER**

Indiana Conservation Officers will join a national campaign in late June aimed at creating heightened publicawareness of the dangers of boating under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Operation Dry Water (ODW) is scheduled for June 28-30, just before the Fourth of July.

(www.OperationDryWater.org) is a nationwide education and enforcement initiative developed by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) in partnership with the U.S. Coast Guard.

ODW

Since ODW launched in 2009. the percentage of boating fatalities in the United States in which alcohol is listed as a contributing factor has decreased from 19 percent to 17 percent. Despite the decrease, boating while intoxicated (BWI) accounts for a disproportionate number of onthe-water deaths. In 2011, alcohol was a contributing factor in just 8 percent of boating accidents overall but figured in 17 percent of boating fatalities.

In Indiana, the blood-alcohol limit for boat operators is the same as for vehicle drivers -0.08. However, studies show that boat operators become impaired by alcohol sooner than people on land because of the motion of the boat, the glare and heat of the sun, and dehydration from sweating.

Boat operators convicted of boating while intoxicated can lose their boat operating and vehicle driving privileges, and face jail time and fees.

According to Indiana Conservation Officers, the safest plan is to have a designated boat operator who is not drinking alcohol.

Citizens often report intoxicated boaters to authorities, which demonstrates an increased public awareness that lawabiding boaters are concerned about safety.

"Keeping our lakes, rivers and reservoirs safe takes an effort from all of us, and we appreciate the efforts of our safe boaters," said Lt. Kenton Turner, boating law administrator for the DNR Division of Law Enforcement.


On behalf of the Jackson Jaguars 4-H club in Wells County we would like to thank Bolinger's for allowing us to hold our annual Car Wash at their place of business.
