LIBRARY OPEN NOW

The librarians of Warren have missed our story loving visitors, and are anxious to see our friends again. As we welcome you back inside the building, please understand we are having a phased in, responsible opening. We opened our doors back up to the public on Tuesday, May 26th. The following procedures will be in place during Stage 3 of Indiana's Back on Track plan.

We are honoring social distancing, and in our effort to protect library staff and patrons, we ask that you visit us when you are clear of symptoms of ANY illness. We are also expecting everyone to wear a face mask inside the library. We do have a limited supply available if you have been unable to find a mask, just pick one up inside the door. Hand sanitizer is available at the front desk. The downstairs restroom will be locked, but we can unlock it upon request. For those who still prefer curbside service during Stage 3, we will be continuing taking requests.

We enjoy having patrons and visitors linger and browse in our library, but we have to cut down on that right now. Only ten people at a time will be permitted in the building. We also cannot allow anyone under the age of 16 to be in the library without a parent present. Magazines and newspapers

cannot be browsed through at this time, but the magazines can be retrieved for checkout by librarians upon request. This is one of our most touched areas, and we want to keep everyone protected.

We will have two computers available for the public to use, social distanced apart. The computer keyboards are covered, as are the mice. Hand sanitizer will need to be used before using a computer. Our copier will be available for printing, but will be used only by library staff, no self-service.

Parents, tell your kids that we have NOT canceled Summer Reading! Those interested in reading good books and earning prizes this year can sign up starting June 1st. Ages 3 to adults are all welcome to participate. We have two special guests that are scheduled to come to Warren in June, details will be posted soon. The theme for 2020 is "Imagine Your Story."

Something interesting we noticed over the last two months: our electronic book circulations have increased.

Our patrons have really dived deep into this service while we were closed. April had our highest number of circulations on record.

New data about COVID-19 is coming out all the time, so these procedures may change. We hope to relax some of these rules when

Huntington County enters Stage 4, predicted to be mid-June. We understand how our current expectations can be an inconvenience and a frustration to some. We will expand our services as soon as it is safe to do so. We have all of YOUR and OUR health and safety as our first priority. See you all soon!

EXTENDS HOURS FOR PRIMARY

INDIANAPOLIS —The Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) announced today branches will extend hours of operation for the primary election. Branches will be open on Monday, June 1, from 8:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. and on Tuesday, June 2, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. to issue ID cards and driver's licenses to be used for identification at a polling place. Appointments are not required for these two days of operation, but service is limited.

Under Indiana state law, BMV branches are open to the public for extended hours on Election Day and the day before Election Day. To meet the requirements of this law the BMV will not require appointments for Hoosiers needing an ID for voting purposes. During this extended period of operation, service offerings are limited to new, amended, renewed, or replacement ID and driver's license for voting purposes. All other BMV services are not available

June 1 and June 2. Appointments will resume on June 3 and will be required for all transactions. Appointments can be scheduled here: <https://www.in.gov/bmv/2405.htm>.

For the safety of BMV customers and employees CDC guidelines have been implemented for all BMV related business:

All customers and employees should leave 6 feet of space between themselves and others. Hands should be washed and sanitized frequently. Masks are required for customer-facing employees and are strongly recommended for customers. Lobby chairs will be positioned at least 6 feet apart.

The number of customers permitted in the branch at one time will vary by location. Once the permitted number is reached, the next customer will be asked to wait outside. Sidewalks will be marked as necessary with appropriate spacing.

Frequently touched items will be cleaned with disinfectant wipes between each customer. Plexiglas barriers will be cleaned a minimum of twice a day. All branches will be cleaned the evening of June 1, 2020 and June 2, 2020.

Individuals who hold a driver's license or ID card that

has expired after the last General Election (November 6, 2018) may use the expired card as proof of identification for voting purposes.

Recipe Box

With summertime approaching in Indiana nothing is better (other than ice cream) than having a big ole dish of strawberry shortcake. Strawberries are in abundance in the months of May and June. Whether it is from your own strawberry bed, the local fruit market, or even in the grocery store they're just as good either way. So this brings me to my story.

Ivanhoe's has been a famous touring destination for our residents at Heritage Pointe. With the restrictions placed on us, our activities personnel elected to do a mystery trip with their makeshift bus. With many clues going out through the week as to where the "bus" was going. Long story short they brought the strawberry shortcake to them instead of them going to Ivanhoe's and delivered bowls of strawberry shortcake to all the residents. My job was cleaning all 78 pounds of strawberries getting them ready for the big feast.

So without further ado, I bring you my version of strawberry shortcake, homemade style and then after my version I will give you the quick way of making strawberry shortcake, which most of you already know. Enjoy, I know I have, twice already!!

Hot milk sponge cake

1c. flour 1 c. sugar
 1 tsp. baking powder ½ c. milk
 2 eggs 2 Tbsp. butter

Beat eggs on high speed about 4 minutes till thick. Gradually add the sugar beating at medium speed for 4 to 5 minutes or till light and fluffy. Add flour and baking powder. Beat at low speed just till combined.

In a saucepan, heat and stir milk and butter till butter is melted. Add to the batter beating till combined. Pour into a 9x9x2 greased dish or pan. Bake 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes or till a toothpick inserted comes out clean.

Strawberry glaze

¾ c. sugar 2 Tbsp cornstarch 1c. cold water

Combine all ingredients in a saucepan and cook over medium heat till clear and thick, remove from heat and add a small box of strawberry jello. Stir well. When cooled completely, pour over 3 lbs of hulled strawberries and serve

ELECTION SAFETY

Every election cycle, Indiana election officials take great care to ensure your vote is safe and secure. This year is no different, but the COVID-19 pandemic has required us to safeguard a new aspect of the Election Day experience: your health.

COVID-19 numbers are trending in the right direction, but we must remain vigilant in the days to come. My office has been working to supply all 92 Indiana counties with personal protective equipment, or PPE, so that poll workers and election staff are properly outfitted for Primary Election Day.

Using federal dollars, many of our PPE supplies have been contracted from Indiana suppliers, and we have purchased thousands of units of hand sanitizer, dispenser bottles, disinfectant cleaner, microfiber cloths, disposable gloves, face masks, face shields, and sneeze guards. We've been very careful not to solicit vendors supplying critical care needs, or to interfere with those supply lines. We received our materials at a state warehouse last week. Some supplies are being stored as surplus in the event of a recount, and the rest have been distributed to counties.

We couldn't have done this alone. The Indiana National Guard has been invaluable, taking the lead on receiving, sorting, and shipping supplies to all 92 counties. Without the support of the

Guard, we wouldn't have been able to stay on schedule with this project.

It's important to note these supplies only cover poll workers and election staff, so for those of you planning to vote early or in-person this primary election, please use common sense, and if you are high-risk, wear a mask to your polling place. We all need to do our part to keep our communities safe. I urge you to join our poll workers in following CDC guidelines for personal protection and social distancing.

The polls will be open on Election Day, Tuesday, June 2nd. Many Hoosiers value the experience of casting their ballot in person, which is why we're working diligently to keep our polling places safe and sanitary. If you prefer to vote in person, I encourage you to consider voting early. Early voting will be available in every county from May 26th to June 1st at noon. We've chosen to open early voting for a week to reduce the number of Hoosiers going to the polls at the same time.

Despite the extra precautions we've had to take, I am pleased to report that interest in the primary remains high. Hundreds of thousands of Hoosiers have taken advantage of no-excuse absentee voting, and many more have reached out to ask about early voting options.

clerk, visit www.IndianaVoters.com. Election season is moving full speed ahead in Indiana, and thanks to so many people around this state, we can cast our votes with confidence.

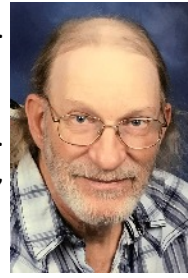

occurred next to Dealey Plaza and the grassy knoll. Then we toured the 6th floor "Shooter's Perch." That corner of the building is walled off with Plexiglas. This area of the facility is now called the Sixth Floor Museum.

Individual audio devices, tethered with a lanyard, informed tourists about events as one moved from one newsworthy wall exhibit to the succeeding one. It was all well organized and presented. We spent about one hour in the museum.

Information disseminated in the museum stated that Lee Harvey Oswald was a relatively new, part-time employee of the depository and the only one unaccounted for immediately after the shooting! His fingerprints were matched to the rifle. Some of the events and investigation is still being questioned.

Afterwards, our bus retraced the motorcade route from Main Street to Houston Street to that acute, fatal turn onto Elm Street! Eerie!

Afterward, we drove by the downtown Neiman Marcus, flagship building. There were many, bright yellow street cars powered by overhead, electrical cables that traversed portions of the city. You don't see that in US cities very often any more.

Stayed overnight in a Dallas suburb at a Marriott Hotel.

Leaving early tomorrow for Memphis, TN.

BMV FEES RESUME JULY 1

The Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) announced today administrative penalty fees will resume July 1. All Hoosiers with expired driver's licenses, permits, state identification cards, and vehicle registrations need to complete renewal transactions before July 1 to avoid paying an administrative penalty fee. Title transactions and new vehicle registration must also be completed before July 1.

Administrative fees have been waived since March 16 to assist the needs of Hoosiers who were not able to utilize in branch services due to the public health emergency created by novel Coronavirus, COVID-19. During this time, online credit card transaction fees were also waived. Those fees will resume on July 1. Online transactions paid by electronic check, using checking account and routing numbers, do not incur a fee.

It is critical Hoosiers whose renewal deadline has passed or is upcoming, who need to complete a title transfer, or register a new vehicle, schedule an appointment with the BMV to complete their transaction prior to the June 30, 2020 deadline. The Indiana BMV continues to encourage Hoosiers to complete transactions online whenever possible. Hoosiers may also visit a BMV Connect kiosk, call the contact center, or return renewal through USPS using preprinted forms. You can read a full list of modifications, closures, and
